COMMUNICATION OF THE CHAIRMAN OF THE COMMISSION Agenda item 2

The Commission,

Having heard the Communication of the Chairman,

- 1. Thanks him for his Communication;
- 2. Appreciates his words of welcome and greetings extended to all Members, non-members, the representatives of international organizations present at the meeting and the Secretary-General and his officers; and
- 3. Agrees with his suggestion that to succeed in the 1990s, the countries of the region should devote more resources towards development of tourism infrastructure and upgradation of skills of personnel in the tourism sector.

- 4. <u>Calls upon</u> the Members to extend their support and cooperation in full measure to the Secretary-General in order to achieve the objectives of the programme of work during the current biennium.

PRESENTATION OF THE STATISTICAL MONOGRAPH OF THE REGION Agenda item 4

The Commission,

<u>Having listened</u> to the detailed presentation of the Statistical Monograph for South Asia,

<u>Having considered</u> the Statistical Monograph circulated among the participants,

1. <u>Appreciates</u> the submission of the Statistical Monograph which will be of immense value to the national tourism administrations in the region in their planning and marketing activities;

- 2. <u>Notes</u> the summary of the latest tourism trends in the region and the world as a whole;
- 3. <u>Urges</u> the Secretariat to include more analytical information as well as brief technical notes on the country-specific methodologies of data collection and classification so that the finished data is more comparable;
- 4. Requests the Secretariat to conduct a seminar/workshop in the region to implement the recommendations of the Ottawa Conference on Travel and Tourism Statistics, and accepts with gratitude the offer of India to host the seminar/workshop during the first half of 1996; and
- 5. <u>Calls upon</u> the Members to supply the statistical data to the Secretariat regularly and on a time-bound basis.

OF WORK FOR 1994-1995 INCLUDING REGIONAL ACTIVITIES AND
SUGGESTIONS FOR THE GENERAL PROGRAMME OF WORK FOR 1996-1997
Agenda item 5 (document CSA/31/2)

The Commission,

<u>Having considered</u> the working document submitted by the Secretary-General on the subject,

- Notes the various activities carried out during the first half of the current biennium and the development of relations with Members and international organizations;
- 2. <u>Notes</u> the activities planned for the second half of the biennium;
- 3. <u>Notes with satisfaction</u> that a workshop on sustainable tourism development and an educating the educators course were conducted in India in 1994 and an educating the educators course is scheduled to be held in Pakistan in 1995;
- 4. <u>Greatly appreciates</u> the internship scheme introduced by the Organization and <u>calls upon</u> the Members to take full advantage of the scheme;

- 5. <u>Urges</u> the Secretariat that, resources permitting, training programmes oriented towards the operational sector should be conducted in the region;
- Requests the Secretariat to explore the possibilities of designating a WTO education and training centre in the region;
- 7. <u>Suggests</u> that development of **Spice Route** on the lines of the Silk Route, be undertaken with the joint efforts of the Members and international organizations;
- 8. Accepts with gratitude the offer of the representative of ESCAP to provide faculties for in-country training programmes in the region;
- 9. <u>Joins</u> the representatives of Iran, Maldives and Sri Lanka in appreciating the Secretariat's technical cooperation activities in the region; and
- 10. <u>Urges</u> the Members to incorporate the tourism sector into their national development programmes and grant it a high priority, taking advantage of the mechanisms existing for this purpose, such as WTO's technical assistance.
