Form B enables the respondent to calculate the room and bed nights. This is then transcribed to the main questionnaire, Form A.

Instructions:

- I. Reporting period: Enter the reporting month and year
- II. Room Nights: For each night in a calendar month, enter the total number of rooms occupied. If no rooms were occupied on any given night, enter a zero (-0-) for those nights.
- III. **Bed Nights:** For each night in a calendar month, enter the total number of beds occupied in the facility. If no beds were filled on any given night, enter a zero (-0-) for those nights.

MONTHLY OCCUPANCY RATE FORMULA

The Room Occupancy Rate is equal to the reported number of room nights occupied as a percentage of reported room nights available. If a hotel has 25 rooms in total, on a daily basis, 25 rooms are potentially available for lodging. If the reporting month is January, over the 31 day period in the month, the maximum occupancy would be 25×31 =775 rooms (You would multiply by 28 for February, 31 for March, 30 for April, etc.). Taking a full month of data, you can calculate the total number of rooms occupied by simply adding up the units that were occupied during the month. If 20 rooms are occupied on 1st January, 19 rooms on 2nd January, 23 rooms on the 3rd of January, etc., we can calculate the room occupancy rate as follows:

- 1. Add up all the number of rooms occupied for the 31 day period. In our sample data shown in the table above, the total number of rooms occupied is 494.
- 2. Calculate the maximum occupancy by multiplying the room capacity by the number of days in the month $(25 \times 31 = 775 \text{ rooms})$.
- 3. Using our sample data, the room occupancy rate will be 494 divided by 775 = 63.7%.

Room Occupancy Rate
$$\frac{Fotal \, room \, nights}{= (Capacity \, \times \, Fotal \, calendar \, nights)} \times 100 = \frac{494}{25 \times 31} \times 100 = 63.7\%$$

The same analogy is used to calculate Bed Occupancy Rates.

Number of Clients by Place of Origin

This is the country or region where the guest normally lives/resides. As guests check into a lodge, they are required to indicate their country of residence. This question tries to capture that information. Some countries are grouped, for example Latin America. The guests will not indicate their origin as Latin America but may say Argentina, for example. So it will be up to the respondent to figure out the region in which Argentina is found. The breakdown is as follows:

Here the total number of clients that checked in during the month in question is broken down by their purpose of visit as outlined above. It is a requirement that visitors disclose their purpose of stay at a lodging facility. If we pick "holiday" as an example, what we want is the total number of clients in that month who stated that their purpose of visit to the lodging facility was "holiday".

FORM B: BED NIGHTS AND ROOM NIGHTS

A one-paged accompanying questionnaire is provided to the respondent in order to make it easy for them to compute the room and bed nights sold. This questionnaire is clearly marked "Form B: Room Nights and Bed Nights". Please ensure that the reporting period on this form is the same as the reporting period on the main questionnaire.

For each night in a calendar month, the establishment is to keep a daily record of the total number of rooms occupied and the total number of beds occupied in a facility.

The respondent will then sum all this up and come up with the total number of room and bed nights sold. This total will then be transcribed to the main questionnaire under the "Bed and room Occupancy" section.
