Prof. Richard Butler



Richard Butler holds positions as Emeritus Professor of Tourism at the University of Strathclyde, Glasgow, and Visiting Professor at NHTV University, Breda, Netherlands. He is a geographer, with degrees from Nottingham (BA) and Glasgow (PhD) Universities, and taught for thirty years at the University of Western Ontario in London, Canada, and then at the University of Surrey, where he was Deputy Head (Research) at the School of Management. He has published sixteen books on tourism, and has authored over a hundred journal articles and chapters in books. His main areas of research are tourism destination development, tourism in remote areas, seasonality, and the sustainability of tourism. He is a founding member and former President of the International Academy for the Study of Tourism and a past president of the Canadian Association for Leisure Studies. He has served as consultant for government agencies in the UK, Canada and Australia, and is on the editorial board of several tourism journals.
