The Executive Council,

<u>Having considered</u> the communication of its Chairman, Professor Marios Raphaël, in which he set out five ideas and proposals concerning:

- (a) sponsors for WTO activities;
- (b) promoting WTO's image;
- (c) electronic access to WTO's Documentation Centre;
- (d) creation of a Think Tank;
- (e) meetings of Ministers of Tourism;

Having held an in-depth discussion on this subject,

<u>Having heard</u> the opinion of the Secretary-General concerning the said proposals,

- Warmly thanks its Chairman for his proposals aimed at increasing the effectiveness of the Organization in fulfilling its mission;
- Considers that the wide-ranging and creative debate of this item clearly demonstrates that some of these proposals reflect the genuine interests of the Council Members;
- 3. <u>Thanks</u> the Secretary-General for the progress already made in these areas;
- 4. <u>Considers</u> said proposals broadly consistent with, and complementary to, policies and actions already put under way by the Organization;
- 5. <u>Invites</u> the Secretary-General to consider ways and means of implementing the Chairman's proposals within the Organization's activities, taking into consideration the financial constraints and the workload of the Secretariat, reporting to it as matters arise; and
- 6. <u>Also entrusts</u> the Secretary-General with undertaking a technical study concerning electronic access to WTO's Documentation Centre and with reporting on progress in this area to its forty-ninth session.

General programme of work of the Organization for the period 1994-1995

Agenda item 4 (documents CE/48/4, CE/48/4 Corr.1 and CE/48/4 Add.1)

The Executive Council,

<u>Having considered</u> the report of the Secretary-General on the action taken and planned for implementing the activities included in the Organization's general programme of work for the period 1994-1995, as well as on the activities carried out under the previous programme since its forty-seventh session,

- 1. Takes cognizance of the results recorded in 1993 and the prospects for 1994 with respect to field missions and the execution of technical cooperation projects and desires that the considerable number of operational and sectoral support missions scheduled, especially in the regions that traditionally lag behind so far as technical cooperation is concerned, will result in more projects being entrusted to the Organization;
- Commends with satisfaction the new policy aimed at promoting and developing exchanges within the Organization's network of education and training centres;
- 3. Requests the Secretary-General to report to it, at its next session, on the measures envisaged for implementing that policy;
- 4. <u>Notes with interest</u> the ambitious programme of short-term training courses provided for in 1994 and <u>thanks</u> the Governments of France and Italy for renewing the programmes of scholarships granted to the Organization for training courses;
- 5. <u>Expresses its appreciation</u> at the implementation of the new internship policy intended for officials of national tourism administrations;
- 6. <u>Takes note</u> of the various activities carried out and scheduled in the area of environment and planning and of the results of the seventh meeting of the Environment Committee held at the Organization's Headquarters on 4 and 5 May 1994;
- 7. <u>Welcomes</u> the cooperation links established with several international organizations in this area and <u>encourages</u> the Secretary-General to strengthen them further;

- 8. Notes with satisfaction the preparation of technical manuals to guide countries in implementing the recommendations on tourism statistics, as well as the planning of a number of regional and subregional training seminars in this area and requests the continued enhancement of the statistical publications and progressive inclusion therein of data relating to tourism supply;
- 9. <u>Takes note with interest</u> of the commitment to undertake new methodological studies and research on assessment of the economic importance and effects of tourism, provided for in the programme of work;
- 10. <u>Requests</u> the Secretary-General to inform it, at its next session, of the outcome of the fourth meeting of the Ottawa Conference Steering Committee;
- 11. <u>Notes with satisfaction</u> the results of the Experts' Meeting on Tourist Security and of the seminar on the quality of tourism, held recently at Madrid;
- 12. Expresses its appreciation at the efforts made to enhance the quality of editing, presentation and production of the Organization's publications and requests that certain publications or studies carried out on a regional basis should be communicated to all the Members when that appears desirable;
- 13. <u>Takes note</u> of the new technical information services and products that will be provided by the Organization's Documentation Centre; and
- 14. <u>Expresses its thanks</u> to the staff of the Secretariat for the efforts made in implementing the general programme of work of the Organization.

<u>Having taken note</u> of the Secretary-General's report on the agreements concluded or under negotiation with the Governments of Canada, Spain and Japan,

- 1. <u>Welcomes</u> the establishment of the Permanent Secretariat of the Affiliate Members at the Organization's Headquarters, which has been operational since 12 November 1993, the date on which the agreement was signed with the Spanish Government;
- 2. <u>Requests</u> the Secretary-General to conclude the agreement with the Government of Canada concerning the Regional Secretariat of the Affiliate Members at Montreal;

Having heard the statement by the representative of Japan confirming that Japan is prepared to meet most of the expenses attributable to the new Regional Support Office for Asia and the Pacific at Osaka, which could probably open officially in April 1995,

3. <u>Reiterates its gratitude</u> to the Japanese Government for its generosity;

- 4. <u>Encourages</u> the Secretary-General to pursue is discussions with the Japanese Government with a view to concluding, as soon as possible, an agreement concerning the Regional Support Office for Asia and the Pacific;

Report of the Secretary-General on the financial situation and plan of expenditure for 1994

Agenda item 7(b) (documents CE/48/7(a), CE/48/7(b), CE/48/7(b) Add.1 and CE/48/7(b) Add.2)

The Executive Council,

<u>Having before it</u> the report on the financial situation for the current year, and

<u>Having taken cognizance</u> of the statements by the Secretariat and the Chairman of the Committee on Budget and Finance,

- 1. <u>Takes note</u> of the report on the plan of expenditure for 1994 for execution of the general programme of work, which matches expenditure to expected income;
- 2. <u>Notes</u> that the plan of expenditure for the current financial year remains within the limits of the appropriations approved by the General Assembly for this purpose;
- 3. <u>Expresses its satisfaction</u> at the efforts made by the Secretary-General to contain the fixed costs of the Organization, enabling more funds to be devoted to operational activities;

- 4. <u>Approves</u>, in accordance with the applicable provisions of the Staff Regulations and Rules and the recommendations of the International Civil Service Commission,
 - (a) the incorporation of part of the post adjustment into the base salary of officials of the professional category and above following the "no loss, no gain" principle, resulting in new salary scales effective 1 March 1994 with the corresponding adjustments in the percentages used for calculating the staff assessment deductible from gross salaries (Staff Rule 12(7));
 - (b) the provisional application by the Secretary-General of the anticipated increase in the salaries and allowances of general service officials effective 1 January 1994, requesting him to report back to it on this matter at its forty-ninth session; and
- 5. <u>Urges</u> Members that have not yet discharged their financial obligations to take the necessary steps to pay their contributions for 1994 as soon as possible, thereby avoiding delays that could hamper programme execution.

Auditors' report and administrative accounts of the Organization for the financial year 1993

The Executive Council,

<u>Having before it</u> the reports of the Auditors and of the Committee on Budget and Finance on the accounts for the financial year 1993,

- 1. <u>Notes with satisfaction</u> that, in the financial year 1993, an overall balance was maintained between budgetary expenditure and income;
- 2. Expresses its satisfaction at the high level of collection of arrear contributions and of contributions for the financial year 1993 and recommends the Secretary-General to persist in 1994 in his approaches to Members owing contributions to the Organization, in order to secure the payment of their arrears;

- 3. Requests the Secretary-General to transmit to the General Assembly, with the favourable opinion of the Council, the administrative accounts for the financial year 1993; and
- 4. Expresses its thanks to the Auditors, Mr. Angel Turrión (Spain) and Mr. T.M.A.V.S. Fernando (Sri Lanka), for their report.

Application of Article 34 of the Statutes and paragraph 13 of the Financing Rules attached to the Statutes

The Executive Council,

<u>Having been informed</u> of the application to the Members referred to in document CE/48/7(d) of the provisions of Article 34 of the Statutes and paragraph 13 of the Financing Rules attached to the Statutes,

<u>Having considered</u> the situation of the Members entitled to suspension of the provisions of Article 34 of the Statutes and/or paragraph 13 of the Financing Rules attached to the Statutes,

- 1. <u>Notes</u> that the Full Members ECUADOR, LEBANON, LIBYAN ARAB JAMAHIRIYA, SYRIAN ARAB REPUBLIC and VENEZUELA have complied wholly or in part with their payment plans;
- 2. Requests the Secretary-General to inform it of the fulfilment of the commitments undertaken by the Full Members CAMBODIA, CONGO, SUDAN and YEMEN and the Affiliate Members DA'SILVA TRAVEL SERVICES and PATRONATO PROVINCIAL DE TURISMO DE GRANADA, in order to be able to decide at its next session whether the provisions of Article 34 and of paragraph 13 should be reapplied to them;
- 3. Requests the Secretary-General to intensify his contacts with Members in arrears in the payment of their contributions with a view to reaching agreement with them for the settlement of their debts;

- 4. <u>Entrusts</u> the Regional Commissions with supporting the Secretary-General in his efforts in this regard;
- 5. <u>Urges</u> Members in arrears to take immediate steps to pay their contributions; and
- 6. Approves the recommendation of the Committee on Budget and Finance that requests for suspension of the application of paragraph 13 of the Financing Rules should be submitted to the Executive Council only once every two years, that is to say to the session of the Executive Council immediately preceding the session of the General Assembly.

Social protection of the Organization's staff: state of the issue

The Executive Council,

Recalling General Assembly resolutions 265(VIII) and 320(X),

Recalling also its decisions 12(XLV) and 9(XLVI),

Taking into account Article 19 of the Staff Regulations whereby the Secretary-General is authorized to establish a retirement scheme for the staff similar to those existing in international organizations as well as a participatory health insurance scheme for retired officials,

<u>Having considered</u> the report of the Secretary-General on social protection of the Organisation's staff,

- 1. <u>Expresses its satisfaction</u> at the significant progress made in the field of health insurance for active staff as well as for retiring staff allowing them to maintain their participation in the health insurance scheme;
- 2. <u>Approves</u> the new arrangements made by the Secretary-General in the field of health insurance in favour of its active and retiring officials, and in principle the measures proposed in this regard;

- 3. <u>Takes note</u> of the efforts made by the Secretary-General on the issue of the pension scheme;
- 4. Requests the Secretary-General to pursue his consultations with a view to improving the social protection of staff members after separation from service (pension) in consultation with the representatives of the WTO staff; and
- 5. <u>Invites</u> the Secretary-General to inform it at its fortyninth session of any progress made on this issue.
