Noting with interest the progress recorded in various fields of the Organization's activity, and in particular the healthier financial situation, a work programme more consistent in volume and more pragmatic in approach, the effective deployment of the new Regional Representatives and the new strategy for Affiliate Members,

Expresses its appreciation to the Secretary-General and the

The Executive Council,

<u>Having considered</u> the report of the Secretary-General on the Organization's technical cooperation activities,

- 1. <u>Takes note</u> of the results recorded in 1991 with respect to sectoral support missions, project execution and income for the Organization's budget;
- 2. <u>Desires</u> that great attention be paid to monitoring the work of consultants involved in technical cooperation and that an effort be made to expand the basis of their recruitment among nationals of member States;
- 3. Requests the Secretary-General to pay close attention to developments under way in the United Nations system concerning technical cooperation and development assistance and to submit to it at its forty-fourth session an assessment of the consequences of the current United Nations Development Programme meetings for the funding of tourism projects of member States, as well as their possible impact on the Organization's budget; and
- 4. <u>Hopes</u> that the faster pace of technical assistance missions and field visits by Secretariat representatives in 1992 will swiftly result in more development projects being entrusted to the Organization.

The Executive Council,

<u>Having considered</u> the report of the Secretary-General concerning education and training, marketing and promotion, environment and development, and facilitation and liberalization activities.

Recalling its decision 4(XLI),

<u>Having considered</u> the proposal for a new structure of the WTO Education and Training Network which would allow education and training institutions of different types and categories to join the Network and thus work together with the Organization,

<u>Aware</u> of the increasing number of applications from various categories of educational institutions to acquire the status of WTO Education and Training Centre,

1. Requests the Secretary-General:

- (a) to inform it of the results achieved by the various Centres having regard to the obligations they have accepted and to give his opinion, in the light of those results, on the positive and negative implications of a continued expansion of the Network;
- (b) to inform it of the detailed criteria proposed for the new Network structure which would aim to include establishments in the various categories envisaged;
- (c) to submit to it at its forty-fourth session a draft decision taking account of the above factors so that it may, at that time, take a decision concerning a possible further expansion of the Network;

- 2. <u>Takes note</u> of the extensive calendar of short-term training activities and of the distance learning courses, urging the Secretary-General to make available all four courses, offered at present in English only, in the Spanish and French languages also;
- 3. <u>Thanks</u> the Governments of France and Italy for the renewal of scholarships for longer-term training at the WTO Centres in Paris and Rome;
- 4. <u>Encourages</u> other Members that have a WTO Centre in their countries to explore this possibility also;

Recalling Assembly resolution 284(IX),

- 5. Notes with satisfaction the progress made by the Secretary-General in ensuring the implementation of the recommendations of the International Conference on Travel and Tourism Statistics held at Ottawa, Canada, from 24 to 28 June 1991, in particular by producing technical manuals and organizing regional seminars on this subject, such initiatives being especially valuable for the developing countries;
- 6. <u>Commends</u> the Secretary-General for including in the programme of its present session a Seminar to consider the first results of the Global Tourism Forecasting Study;
- 7. Entrusts the Secretary-General, in accordance with the recommendations of the Ottawa Conference and with Article 8 of the Agreement on Cooperation and Relationships between the United Nations and the World Tourism Organization, with submitting a report on the Ottawa Conference to the twenty-seventh session of the United Nations Statistical Commission, to be held in February 1993;
- 8. <u>Notes with interest</u> the progress made in implementing the Documentation Centre's activities and services;

<u>Having considered</u> the report of the fifth meeting of the Environment Committee held at Headquarters on 23 and 24 April 1992,

- 9. <u>Notes with satisfaction</u> the practical and wide-ranging programme of activities being executed by the Committee in cooperation with various international organizations;
- 10. <u>Approves</u> the Secretary-General's decision to conclude a Working Arrangement with the World Meteorological Organization (WMO) so as to facilitate cooperation between WMO and WTO; and
- 11. Approves the Committee's report;

Recalling its decisions 5(XXXIX) and 4(XLI),

- 12. Encourages the Secretary-General to attend the United Nations Conference on Environment and Development at Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, in June 1992 so as to deliver, during the General Debate of the Conference, a policy statement on tourism on behalf of the Organization, prepared in association with the Members of the Executive Council and the Environment Committee;
- 13. Requests the Secretary-General to inform it at its forty-fourth session of WTO's participation in UNCED and the planned follow-up;

Aware of the growing importance of health and safety issues,

14. Expresses its satisfaction with the outcome of the Conference on Food Safety and Tourism held in Tunisia in November 1991 in cooperation with the Government of Tunisia and the World Health Organization and with the dissemination to Members of brochures concerning travellers' health advice, tourism safety and opportunities for the handicapped;

<u>Having considered</u> the reports of the eleventh and twelfth meetings of the Facilitation Committee held at Headquarters in December 1991 and April 1992, respectively;

- 15. Notes with satisfaction the participation of representatives of the GATT and UNCTAD in the work of the Committee, which enabled it to examine the progress made in liberalizing international trade in tourism services; and
- 16. Approves the Committee's reports;

Having been informed of the conclusions and recommendations of the International Conference on Youth Tourism, held at New Delhi, India from 18 to 21 November 1991,

- 17. Thanks the Government of India for generously hosting the Conference; and
- 18. <u>Encourages</u> national tourism administrations, Affiliate Members and youth tourism organizations to take appropriate steps to progressively implement the Conference recommendations.

The Executive Council,

<u>Having before it</u> the report of the Secretary-General on the financial situation of the Organization, and

<u>Having heard</u> the statements by the Secretariat and the Chairman of the Committee on Budget and Finance,

- 1. <u>Takes note</u> of the austerity measures taken by the Secretary-General to contain the Organization's expenditure at the beginning of the financial year, matching it to expected income;
- 2. <u>Takes note with satisfaction</u> of the report on the plan of expenditure for 1992 for execution of the general programme of work;
- 3. Notes that, in addressing the need to maintain a balance between actual income and expenditure, the plan of expenditure respects the order of priority assigned to each of the operational activities in the general programme of work by allocating accordingly the funds approved by the General Assembly for this purpose;
- 4. <u>Urges</u> Members that have not complied with the provisions of paragraph 12 of the Financing Rules attached to the Statutes to take the necessary measures to pay their contributions for 1992, avoiding delays that could hamper programme execution; and
- 5. <u>Decides</u>, in accordance with the applicable provisions of the Staff Regulations and Rules,
 - (a) that the revised salary scale and allowances for general service staff shall take effect from 1 January 1992;

- (b) that the incorporation of part of the post adjustment into the base salary shall be made following the principle of "no loss-no gain", resulting in new scales effective 1 March 1992 with the corresponding adjustment in the percentages used for calculating the staff assessment deductible from gross salaries (Staff Rule 12(7)); and
- (c) that adjustment of the education grants shall be applicable to the current academic year.

<u>Having before it</u> the reports of the Secretary-General, of the Auditors and of the Committee on Budget and Finance on the accounts for the financial year 1991,

- Notes with satisfaction the simpler presentation of the financial statements;
- 2. <u>Notes</u> also that in the financial year 1991 an overall balance was successfully maintained between budgetary expenditure and income;
- 3. Approves the recommendation of the Committee on Budget and Finance that, if amicable agreement cannot be reached by the end of the present financial year with the Spanish authorities for the reimbursement of the accumulated amount of Value Added Tax paid for services by the Organization, the accounts should be adjusted accordingly;
- 4. Requests the Secretary-General to keep it informed of his negotiations with the Spanish authorities on this issue;
- 5. Expresses its satisfaction at the high level of arrear contributions collected, recommending the Secretary-General to pursue in 1992 his approaches to Members owing contributions to the Organization, in order to secure the payment of their arrears;

Agenda item 4(d) (documents CE/43/4(d), CE/43/4(d) Add.1 and CE/43/4(b))

The Executive Council,

<u>Having noted</u> the application of the provisions of Article 34 of the Statutes and of paragraph 13 of the Financing Rules attached to the Statutes to the Members listed in the Annex to document CE/43/4(d),

1. Requests the Secretary-General to report to it on the outcome of the approaches made to the Members to which Article 34 of the Statutes and paragraph 13 of the Financing Rules attached to the Statutes are applied;

Having considered the situation of the Members entitled to suspension of the provisions of Article 34 and/or paragraph 13 of the Financing Rules in pursuance of General Assembly resolution 281(IX),

- 2. Notes with satisfaction that the Full Members ECUADOR, LIBYAN ARAB JAMAHIRIYA, PANAMA, VENEZUELA and YEMEN, and the Affiliate Members AFRICA TRAVEL ASSOCIATION and TOURCONSULT/INTERNATIONAL S.A. have paid their contributions for 1991;
- 3. <u>Notes further</u> that IRAQ, LEBANON, NIGER, SYRIAN ARAB REPUBLIC and UGANDA have communicated to the Secretary-General their intention to discharge their financial obligations;

- 4. Requests the Secretary-General, following the recommendation of the Committee on Budget and Finance, to inform it concerning the effective compliance with payment undertakings given by NIGER, SYRIAN ARAB REPUBLIC and UGANDA so that a decision can be taken at its next session concerning the renewed application of the provisions of Article 34 and/or paragraph 13, as the case may be;
- Also requests the Secretary-General, applying the legal advice obtained on the contribution arrears of the former Democratic Yemen, to contact the Government of the REPUBLIC OF YEMEN to request a plan for the payment of its contribution arrears, so that suspension of the aforementioned provisions can be maintained;
- 6. <u>Notes with satisfaction</u> that PERU has submitted a plan for the payment of its contribution arrears; and
- 7. <u>Invites</u> the Secretary-General to inform it at its forty-fourth session of the situation regarding Peru's effective compliance with its undertakings so that the Council may recommend the General Assembly to give favourable consideration to the request by this Member for suspension of the application to it of Article 34 of the Statutes and paragraph 13 of the Financing Rules attached to the Statutes.

- 2. <u>Accepts with gratitude</u> the generous offer of the Canadian Government to establish at Montreal a regional secretariat of the Affiliate Members for the Americas;
- 3. <u>Notes</u> that this offer has no direct or indirect implications for the Organization's budget;
