End of 19th - 20th century

- In 1897 the propagandistic Climate & Beautification
 Society of Malaga was created
- Malaga as a winter destination
- First luxury destination. High social level





60's & 70's

- 1959. The Pez Espada hotel in Torremolinos
- Development of the sun & beach travel sector
- Mass Tourism. The tourism as a basic good
- Torremolinos concentrates the offer accomodation of Malaga
