Technical Assistance Missions

Of shorter duration, carried out at the request of countries or groups of countries to identify, evaluate and describe specific technical assistance

Usually result in direct **UNWTO** recommendation reports to Members or in formulating further project proposals for funding by UNDP and/or other financing sources


TECHNICAL COOPERATION IN AFRICA 2012 – 2016 (completed)



UNWTO/CHIMELONG INITIATIVE

The UNWTO and the Chinese Leisure Company Chimelong signed a Partnership Agreement for the implementation of a Portfolio of projects in the field of:

- > Tourism Development, Wildlife Conservation and Sustainable Livelihoods
- > Capacity Building on Tourism Development and Biodiversity Conservation

These would include:

- 1 regional Capacity Building for West and Central Africa
- 2 national Projects for Southern Africa

Operational Budget:

Approximately USD 100,000 per project
