2. VENUE

Thiruvananthapuram (also known as Trivandrum) is the capital and largest city of Kerala. It is located on the west coast of India near the extreme south of the mainland. Thiruvananthapuram is also home to research centers such as the Indian Space Research Organisation's Vikram Sarabhai Space Centre, the Indian Institute of Space Science and Technology, and a campus of the Indian Institutes of Science Education and Research. The city is ranked among the best cities to live in India and is also ranked as the best governed city in India.

Currency and Exchange

Rate USD \$1 is equivalent to

INR 63.83

The Indian Rupee (INR) is the currency used in India. It is subdivided into 1, 2, 5 and 10 coins. Notes are available in denominations of 5, 10, 20, 50, 100, 200, 500 and 2000.

There is no limit to the amount of foreign currency that visitors can bring. Main hotels, restaurants and shopping centres honour major credit cards.

Climate and Clothing

Kerala has a wet and maritime tropical climate influenced by the seasonal heavy rains of the southwest monsoon and northeast monsoon. Around 65% of the rainfall occurs from June to August corresponding to the Southwest monsoon, and the rest from September to December corresponding to Northeast monsoon. March to May often see average temperature (high) of 34 degree Celsius.

Delegates are advised to bring light clothing as the temperature can reach up to 36 degrees Celsius in the day.

Time Difference

Indian Standard Time is 5 hours and 30 minutes ahead of Greenwich mean time zone.

Official Language

English is the official language of the meeting. It is widely spoken and understood throughout the country. Malayalam is the local language spoken by the people of Kerala.

Electricity

India uses 230 Volts, 50 Hz alternating current as the power source. Plugs and sockets have either grounded / earthed 3 Pin connections (Type D) or ungrounded 2 pin connections (Type C). The two pin plug is also called the Euro plug. It has two round 4 mm (0.157 in) pins.



Business and Banking Hours

Banks are open for transaction from 10:00 - 15:30 hrs on weekdays and on First and third Saturdays. Second and Fourth Saturdays will be holidays. Banks and Government offices are closed on public holidays and weekends.

Monsoon Rejuvenation programmes: June-August

Cotton outfits; hats, sunglasses, sunscreen lotion, etc.

Food

All standard restaurants offer a variety of cuisines including Continental, Chinese, Indian and typical Kerala food.

Temple Codes

Some temples do not permit entry to non-Hindus. Strict dress codes are followed in most of the temples. Footwear is banned inside the temple premises.
